2016: 25 years of the National Forest

Since the National Forest was launched a quarter of a century ago, over eight and a half million trees have been planted, new cycle trails and accommodations have been established, as well as the National Forest Way, the 75 mile long distance walking trail.

2016: 300th anniversary of Capability Brown

Arguably England's greatest landscape gardener, 2016 marks the 300th anniversary since the birth of Lancelot 'Capability' Brown. . In 2016 visit any of the many properties and landscapes in Yorkshire including Roche Abbey, Burton Constable Hall, Sledmere House, Ripley Castle, Temple Newsam Wentworth Castle Gardens. Also Harewood House, where in 2016 will see a celebration of this eminent designer and landscape artist through guided walking tours and exhibitions in a new Art of Landscape series. 2016: Durham Cathedral and Castle 30 Year Anniversary as World Heritage Site

Durham World Heritage Site was inscribed on the World Heritage List by UNESCO in 1986, one of the first to be designated alongside the Taj Mahal and Stonehenge. Durham Cathedral and Castle were inscribed because of the site's exceptional architecture and visual drama; its archaeological importance; as well as the political (Norman Conquest) spiritual (medieval Prince Bishops) powers and religious traditions (Cuthbert, Bede and Oswald); and continued use as a place of worship, learning and residence for over 1000 years. durhamworldheritagesite.com

March 2016: Turning 20, Royal Armouries Museum, Leeds

In 2016 The Royal Armouries celebrates its 20th anniversary since it opened to the public on 30th March 1996. The multi-million pound museum was built to house a large part of the national collection of arms and armour, and displays over 8500 objects throughout its six themed galleries: War, Tournament, Oriental, Self-Defence, Hunting, and Peace. It is one of the largest collections of historic arms and armour, comprising the National Collection of Arms and Armour at Leeds, National Artillery Collection at Fort Nelson, and National Firearms Collection. It is also the Keeper of the Tower of London history. May 2016: 90th anniversary of Eric Morecambe's birth

Born in Morecambe in Lancashire on 14 May 1926, Eric Morecambe (born John Eric Bartholomew) is one of England's most-loved comedians. He is best known for his double act with Ernie Wise. 2016 will mark the 90th anniversary since his birth.

April 2016: 200th anniversary of Charlotte Bronte's birth

Charlotte Brontë (21 April 1816 – 31 March 1855) was an English novelist and poet, the eldest of the three Brontë sisters who survived into adulthood and whose novels have become classics of English literature. Visitors to the village of Haworth, where the sisters grew up, can discover more about the authors at the Bronte Parsonage Museum. The 'Bronte' programme will comprise exhibitions, artistic commissions, publications, musical performances, educational projects and numerous other special initiatives to celebrate the life and work of Charlotte Brontë (1816-1855). Highlights include 'Celebrating Charlotte' – an exhibition of treasures from our collection touring to the National Portrait Gallery in London and the Morgan Library and Museum in New York. Tracy Chevalier, author of The Girl With The Pearl Earring, will be guest curator for 'I Shall Go Off Like A Bombshell: Charlotte Brontë, Great And Small' – an exhibition of artefacts, oddities and specially-commissioned contemporary art. July 2016: 150th anniversary of the birth of author Beatrix Potter

Born in London in 1866, Helen Beatrix Potter was best known for her imaginative children's books such as The Tale of Peter Rabbit. Potter spent the majority of her adult life on her farm near Sawrey in Lancashire. Special events will take place at various Beatrix Potter National Trust venues, which will include a children's literary festival at Wray Castle, the first place Beatrix visited in the Lake District, with a brand new guide to tell the story of her life, story telling events and of course a special birthday party on the 28th July.

October 2016: 100th anniversary of the birth of Alf Wight (James Herriot)

3. Attractions/ Exhibitions/Restaurants

Spring 2016: York Theatre Royal

After a £4.1 million redevelopment project, the historic York Theatre Royal is re-opening in spring 2016. This beautiful theatre was built in 1744 on, and among, the site of the medieval St. Leonard's Hospital.. The Redevelopment Project started in March 2015 and this will be the biggest change to the theatre since the 1967 extension. This project will see extended foyer spaces, a revamped 1,000 seat auditorium and improved access around the building.

March 2016: Re-opening of Hastings Pier

Following repeated fire devastation, Hastings Pier was finally closed in 2008 due to structural concerns. Now, after an £11.4 million donation from the Heritage Lottery Fund, Hastings Pier is set to be completely transformed into "one of the coolest-looking piers in the world". Reopening this summer, the pier will host circuses, plays, concerts, film festivals, farmers' markets, urban sports, a restaurant and more.

2016: Piece Hall, Halifax
